The Northern Yorke Peninsula Group of the Australian Plants Society invite artists and photographers from the Copper Coast, Yorke Peninsula and beyond to participate in a community exhibition of works with the theme of Australian Native Plants.

Moonta Gallery of the Arts will be hosting the exhibition during May 2017, which coincides with the busy Kernewek Lowender event.

Exhibits must have Australian Native Plants as the primary theme and we welcome paintings, sculpture, floral arrangements, photography and mixed media.

Landscapes will be accepted if native Australian flora forms the key focal point of the image.

Readily identifiable native flora must feature in each exhibit.

Prior to commencing a proposed exhibit, exhibitors should ensure that the flora to be featured is indeed Australian native flora. Get in touch with us at the Australian Plants

A People's Choice Award will be selected by the viewing public and the winning exhibitor will be announced at the close of the exhibition.

Please refer to the following Terms of Entry for further details.

Terms of Entry

- 1. The exhibition will be hosted by the Moonta Gallery of the Arts located in the Moonta Town Hall, George Street, Moonta.
- 2. Exhibits must be delivered to the Gallery no later than Friday April 28th 2017.
- 3. There is no limit to the number of exhibits from any one artist, however, the NYP APS Group, in conjunction with the Moonta Gallery of the Arts, reserves the right to select works for the exhibition from those submitted.
- 4. NYP APS Group and the Moonta Gallery of the Arts reserve the right to exhibit works to the public for the period of the exhibition.
- 5. It is preferred, but not essential, for works to be available for sale. A commission of 25% of the catalogue price will be deducted by the Moonta Gallery of the Arts.
- 6. All works must be suitably mounted or framed, ready for hanging with large D rings fitted on either side of the back of the frame 10 to 15 cm from the top.
- 7. Identification details must be firmly attached to the back of the work with details including;
 - Title of the work and medium
 - Artist's name
 - Contact details
 - Sale price
 - Written list of exhibits containing the same information.
- 8. Unsold exhibits may be collected and removed after the close of the exhibition.
- 9. As the Kernewek Lowender is a Cornish festival, and is centred on the Copper Coast, exhibits featuring native flora from the northern Yorke Peninsula would give the exhibition a more local feel.
- 10. For some local inspiration, visit some of the local flora hotspots listed below this coming spring, and remember to take photographs and sketches, not plants!
 - Rocky Bend Flora Reserve 7 Km south of Moonta on the Maitland Road
 - Agery National Trust Flora Reserve on the higher ground west of Agery Lake
 - Coastal dune systems south of Wallaroo and south of Port Hughes
 - Coastal clifftops on the southern end of Tickera township.
 - Country cemetery sites can quite often contain excellent native vegetation ie Kulpara & Moonta
 - Old railway corridors such as Wallaroo to North Yelta
 - Some of the 3 chain road reserves offer excellent native vegetation
 - Moonta to Kadina road reserve
 - o Paskeville to Kulpara road reserve
 - o Willamulka Road between Kadina and Bute
 - Ardrossan Grassland Reserve in the middle of Ardrossan
- 11. Further south on Yorke Peninsula, you will also find;
 - Mulbura Park National Trust Flora Reserve 5 Km NNW of Port Vincent
 - Ramsay Conservation Park between Minlaton and Stansbury
 - Innes National Park Stenhouse Bay
